Celebrate! Women's History Month with Mariachi

March sees an opportunity for audiences to revel in color and excitement of some of the finest Mariachi musicians as they take to the stage at the Mission Playhouse and celebrate women's contribution to the art-form.

The Playhouse is delighted to be partnering with the 4th Annual Mariachi Women's Festival to present the show, *iViva Veracruz!*, March 25, as part of the Playhouse's community engagement program *Engage!* Female jarocho and mariachi musicians from Mexico and Texas will join local artists at this vibrant festival to perform traditional and mariachi interpretations of the unique jarocho music style from Veracruz, Mexico.

Mariachi favorites such as La Bamba and El Cascabel are songs native to Veracruz, where they are performed in a lively and danceable style known as son Jarocho. Mexico's female Jarocho ensemble Caña Dulce y Caña Brava will open this year's festival with traditional interpretations of these and other regional classics. Las Alteñas, the finest all-female mariachi group in San Antonio, Texas and the two-time Grammy-winning Mariachi Divas de Cindy Shea from Los Angeles follow with a tribute to the state of Veracruz, performing popular mariachi songs.

The Playhouse has hosted the Mariachi Women's Festival since 2014, a project of the Mariachi Women's Foundation and its Executive Director, Dr. Leonor Xochitl Perez. Mariachi Women's Foundation raises the visibility of mariachi women through performance opportunities, training, and through research and presentations. Prior festivals have featured all-female mariachi groups such as Mariachi Flor de Toloache from New York, Mariachi Las Mariposas from South Texas, Mariachi Flor de San Diego and Mariachi Las Angelitas and Divas from Los Angeles. Other performers have included Trio Ellas, and Dinorah Curkendall from Northern California.

Dr. Perez began performing mariachi music at Griffith Junior High School at 12 years old in the 1970s and was taught by the nation's first native mariachi instructor, Jesus Sanchez. She has performed with mariachi groups in Los Angeles, San Diego and Washington D.C. and was a member of the group, Mariachi Mujer 2000. Performance highlights include Mariachi U.S.A. festivals at the Hollywood Bowl and

two Presidential Inaugural Balls. She has conducted original research on the history of women in mariachi and curated the exhibit, *Viva el Mariachi Femenil* depicting the history of women's participation in mariachi through original photographs and artifacts from 1903 to the present.

Dr. Perez has traveled nationally and internationally to give presentations on the history of women in mariachi, including Mexico, Canada, Astana, Kazakhstan for the International Council on Traditional Music, and at colleges and universities throughout California, Texas and Arizona.







The City of San Gabriel Community Services Department provides trips & tours for adults and children ages 8 and up, accompanied by an adult. Full payment for trips and tours is taken on a first registered, first seated basis at the Community Services Department. Trips are subject to cancellation if the required numbers of participants are not registered by deadline date. Trips depart from the San Gabriel Mission Playhouse parking lot, 320 S. Mission Drive. All cars must be parked on the Broadway Avenue side of the lot only. Participants **must be self-sufficient** and capable of walking and climbing stairs without assistance of others. If unable to do so, a wheelchair and/or trip attendant must be provided by participant. Please notify staff at time of registration if you are taking a wheelchair to ensure space is available.

REFUND POLICY: ALL refunds are subject to a \$10 service charge, unless trip is cancelled by the Department. Refunds for **day trips** are processed if cancellation is received 2 weeks prior to the trip, or if there is a replacement on our waiting list. Refunds for **extended tours** are processed if cancellation is received 4 weeks prior to overnight trip, except where otherwise noted. Trip cancellation insurance is recommended for overnight trips costing \$100 or more.




